Subject: Tree Removal on Hamptons Property

Hi Catarina. I had another question about the Hamptons I forgot to ask.

The report says they want to remove 300 trees on the property. Are any of these trees redwood trees and are on the perimeter of the property along 280 or Wolfe Road?

They should not be removing trees that are along the freeway or the Wolfe perimeter.

Redwood trees are the trees that are planted along 280 from Los Altos to San Jose.

The new hotel behind Penneys at Vallco wanted to remove all the redwood trees along the 280 and

Wolfe Road edges of the property because they said they were dead. The City Council did not let them remove the redwood trees and asked them to instead water them. If redwood trees are removed along 280 by the Hamptons there will be a big hole in the tree canopy along 280 and it will be inconsistent with the way 280 is handled from Los Altos to San Jose along 280.

Also, the complete removal of 300 trees would be like clear cutting the property and that area needs to retain as much shade vegetation as possible.

I also thought they were building the new apartments without tearing down the old ones. Why do so many trees need to be cut down. Are they also cutting down the street trees along Wolfe Road and the 280 on and off ramps? Those trees need to remain because they are public trees.
