Dear Planning Commission:

(Please consider the following as public comment for Item Number 2, Noticing, at the 4/14/26 Planning Commission meeting).

I have had concerns because there have been very few Community Meetings about the SB 330 Housing projects along Stevens Creek Blvd. I have yet to see any type of notice of these meetings And I would have liked to attend them. I am very interested in the upcoming SB 330 housing project At Finch and Stevens Creek Blvd. and hope the public will be told about any Community Meetings for it.

Suggestions for informing the public about Community Meetings:

1. Postcards sent to homes in Cupertino - This used to be done in Cupertino very often. It is an excellent way of letting the public know about projects in their area and across the city. I hope the city will start doing this again.
2. Special Community Meetings Webpage on the Cupertino Website - Many other cities have a Community Meeting page which lists all Community Meetings in that city. Los Altos and San Jose have webpages of their Community meetings. This is extremely helpful and helps the public to stay informed of meetings of all types. The Community Meetings for the SB 330 projects in Cupertino should be listed here on the website.
3. Construction Sign Boards at proposed SB 330 or other Construction Sites - Please list any Community Meetings for these projects at the Construction Sign Board so residents can know when the upcoming Community Meetings are.

I am very concerned that many of the housing bills are trying to make building projects ministerial and the public is being shutout of the whole process. Many people are confused about when or if there have been Community Meetings and often the public feels like the whole process was not transparent.

Having adequate noticing ensures everyone knows about Community Meetings and can ask their questions without feeling ignored. Even the SB 330 projects allow up to five Community Meetings and I do not even see that happening.

I hope by following the above suggestions the communication with the public over Community Meetings Will be enhanced.
