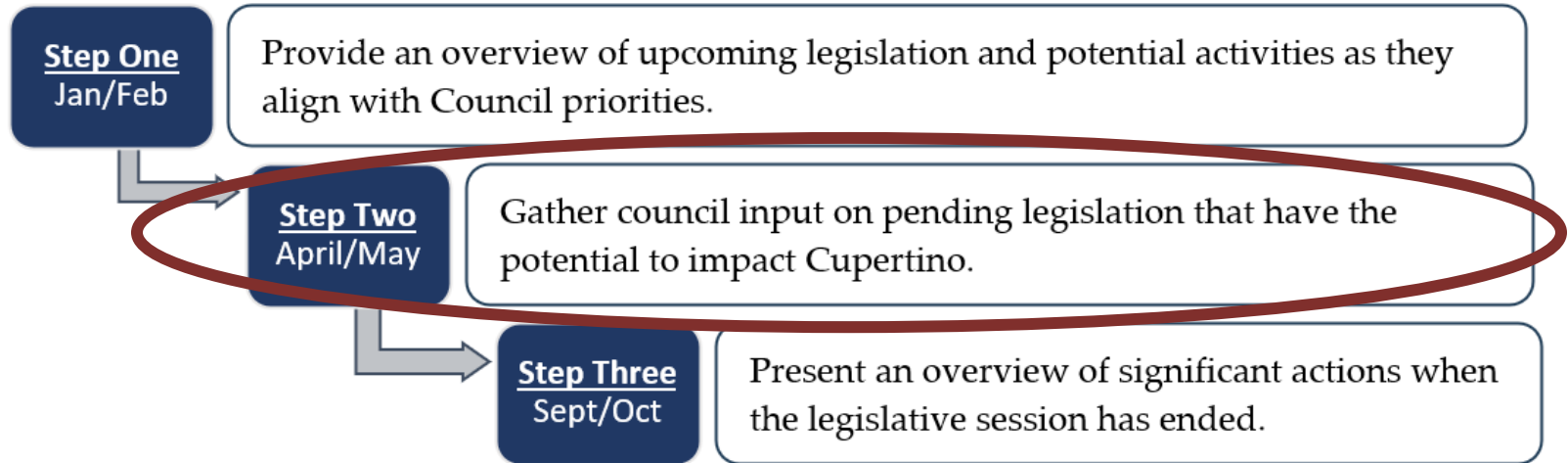

<a href="#">Initiative No. 21-0042A / Sponsored by California Business Roundtable (CBRT)</a>	<i>Taxpayer Protection and Government Accountability Act Initiative</i>	The ballot measure would amend the California Constitution to apply new rules to all new or increased taxes or fees adopted by the state legislature or local agencies. The measure would apply retroactively to new or increased taxes or fees adopted after January 1, 2022.	Opposed by City Council 3/21/23  Opposed by LRC 12/10/21	2/1/23 Initiative qualified for the November 2024 general election ballot.
<a href="#">Initiative 23-0017A1 (Prop 47 Changes)</a>	<i>Homelessness, Drug Addiction, and Theft Reduction Act</i>	The Homelessness, Drug Addiction, and Theft Reduction Act would amend state law to (1) create a new court process for certain drug possession crimes, (2) require a warning of future criminal liability for people convicted of drug distribution, (3) increase penalties for certain drug crimes, and (4) increase penalties for certain theft crimes. # 2024 Legislative Deadlines

<b>February 16</b>	<b>Last day for bills to be introduced</b>
<b>May 17</b>	<b>Last day for fiscal committees to meet</b>
<b>May 24</b>	<b>Last day for each house to pass bills introduced in that house</b>
<b>June 15</b>	<b>Budget Bill must be passed by midnight.</b>
<b>June 27</b>	<b>Last day for a legislative measure to qualify for the Nov. 5 General Election ballot</b>
<b>August 5</b>	<b>Legislature reconvenes from Summer Recess.</b>
<b>August 31</b>	<b>Last day for each house to pass bills. Final Recess begins upon adjournment. Bills go to Governor.</b>
<b>September 30</b>	<b>Last day for Governor to sign or veto bills.</b>

# Bay Area Affordable Housing Measure (BAHFA)

## Summary

Regional bond measure aiming to generate \$10-\$20B for affordable housing in the Bay Area.

## Potential Impact

If approved, Santa Clara County's allocation is estimated as follows:

- \$1.2B if bond is \$10B
- \$2.4B if bond is \$20B

**Staff Recommendation: Support**

# AB 1779 (Irwin) Theft/Jurisdiction

## Summary

This bill would remove the jurisdictional limitations for theft offenses that occur throughout several counties.

## Potential Impact

In Cupertino, retail stores have experienced retail theft crimes. This would hold offenders accountable through a streamlined regional effort.

**Staff Recommendation: Support**

# SB 1143 (Allen) Waste Management

## Summary

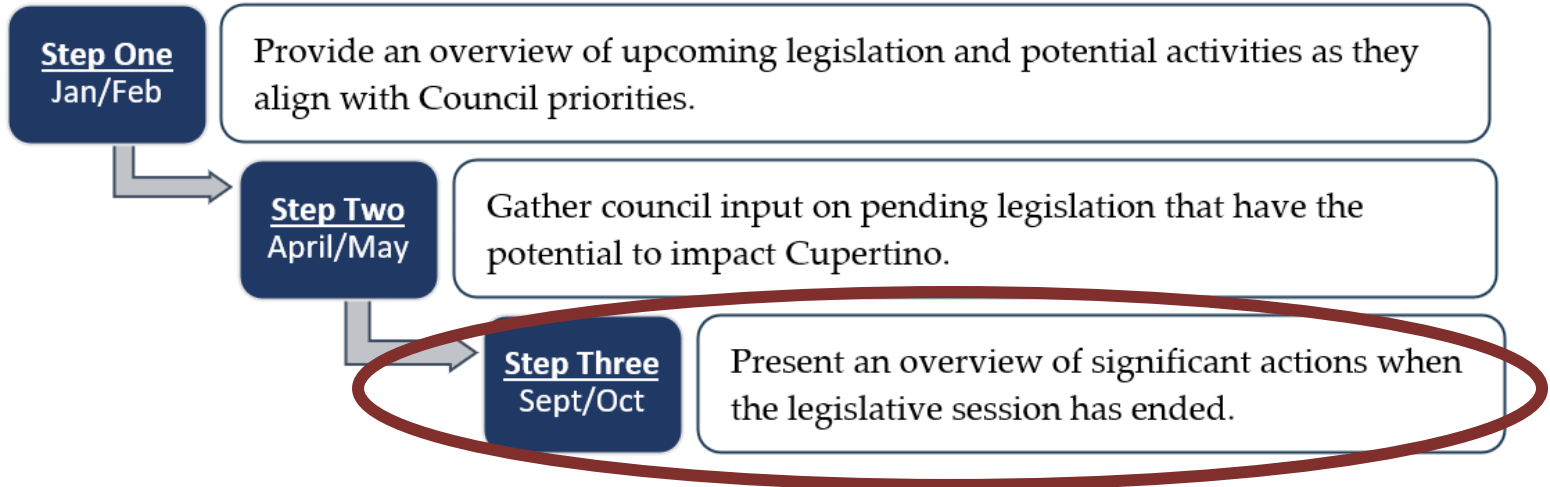
This bill would establish an extended producer responsibility program for California's HHW collection and management system.

## Potential Impact

This bill could bring in direct funds to offset the future costs for the City to continue participating in County's HHW program.
