Re: McClellan Road Separated Bikeways-Phase 2 Project

Dear Cupertino Resident:

The McClellan Road Separated Bikeways Project is a multi-phase project that will install separated/Class IV bike lanes on McClellan Road and Pacifica Drive between Byrne Avenue and Torre Avenue. The first phase of the project, which constructed improvements between Stelling Road and Imperial Avenue, was completed last year. The Public Works Department is now moving forward with the second phase of the project, which will construct similar improvements on McClellan Road between Stelling Road and De Anza Blvd, and along Pacifica Drive between De Anza Blvd and Torre Ave.


The project, which is currently being advertised for construction, will provide an on-street bike lane and physical separation between motor vehicles and bicyclists. As a result, on-street parking will be permanently removed along McClellan Road and Pacifica Drive along the segment between Stelling Road and Torre Avenue. At this time, staff anticipates requesting authorization to proceed with construction, and first reading of the ordinance to prohibit parking, at the regularly scheduled City Council meeting on July 21. The parking prohibition would become effective upon the second reading of the ordinance, tentatively scheduled for the August 18 City Council meeting.

Following the execution of the construction contract and some other administrative tasks, the work will begin. At this time, construction is anticipated to begin in early August. The construction duration is about 3 months.

The project work may temporarily impact the normal use of your property, such as when a driveway is being constructed. In those cases, you will be contacted prior to the work to ensure any special needs are accommodated.
