Council Adopts FY 2025-26 Operating Budget

TUESDAY, JUNE 3, 2025

On Tuesday, June 3, Council unanimously adopted the operating budget of almost \$132 million for FY 2025-26. This includes \$4.2 million for the Capital Improvement Program to enhance city land, parks, buildings, and infrastructure, improving the quality of life for Cupertino residents. The adopted budget also includes funding for the FY 25-27 City Work Program - Council's top priority projects for the next two years. This will ensure that staff efforts are aligned with the goals and focus areas set by the Mayor and Council earlier this year. I appreciate staff's efforts on all their work on the budget adoption process and appreciate Council for their continued support and dedication to the City.

Jollyman Park Playground Ribbon-Cutting

On Friday, June 13, the City hosted the ribbon-cutting ceremony for Cupertino's first All-Inclusive Playground at Jollyman Park marking a major milestone in our commitment to accessible and inclusive public spaces.
