However, if a motion is made to place an item on a future agenda, it requires a majority.
Current Practice	A member remains seated and speaks to be recognized. Staff presentation, public comment, and Council discussion can occur without a motion on the floor.	The Mayor sets time limits for public testimony and individual speakers. Council does this without a vote. See Muni Code 2.08.105 Oral Communications	"I would like to add this item to a future agenda." The Mayor or two Councilmembers may add future agenda items. Council does this without a vote.
