3. Subject: Tantau Ave/Forge Dr Traffic Signal (Dullu)  
Recommended Action: Receive Presentation, Provide Input, and Recommend City Council Approve Installation of Proposed Traffic Signal at the Intersection of Tantau Ave/Forge Dr

MOTION: Madhhipatla moved, and Eschelbeck seconded to recommend that the City Council approve the installation of a traffic signal at Tantau Avenue and Forge Drive to enhance pedestrian safety, facilitate vehicle throughput, and improve operational efficiency.
