June 29, 2026. Legends and SV Champions Awards Ceremony. Attended an awards ceremony in San Jose.

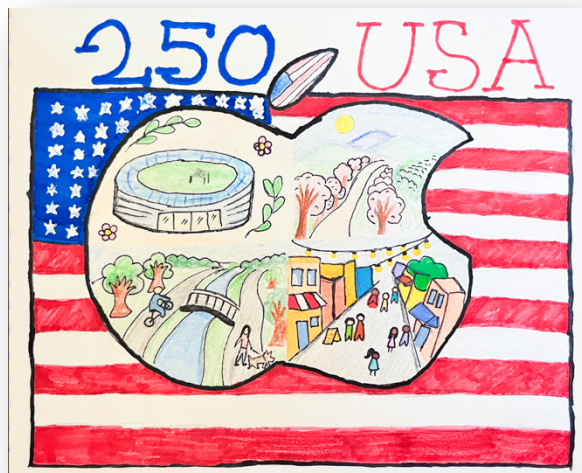
June 30, 2026. Cupertino Disaster Council. City Manager Kapoor chaired the Disaster Council meeting:

July 8, 2026. Agenda Review with Staff.

July 8, 2026. Mayor's Chat. Slide Decks shared are attached.

July 10, 2026. Attended the Ribbon Cutting for the new City of Campbell Police Headquarters building. This is especially interesting because our West Valley Substation will have its lease run out in a few years and a new location may be needed. The Campbell HQ has 46 sworn officers with a total of about 80 employees for their approximately 47k population. Funds from their \$50M 2018 Bond Measure were used for the building which cost \$35.4M. \$30M was from the 2018 Measure O, \$3.9M from State resiliency grant, \$939k from the American Rescue Act, and \$512k from their General Fund. It is a great, modern building and they should have decades of great use at this new facility!
