Daughter from Danang is a UNAFF film festival selection and Oscar nominated film; the UNAFF organizer, Jasmina Bojcic, attended the presentation and led the discussion afterwards. Tax season is upon us, with VITA tax preparation volunteers offering free tax assistance each Sunday. Our popular Wellness series continued with a session presented by acupuncturist Li Yang, where attendees learned simple pain
