Bay Area Pavement Management

- To be eligible for financial and technical aid, must be certified by the Metropolitan Transportation District (MTC)
- In 2018, pavement conditions in Cupertino will likely rank 1st or 2nd out of 16 Santa Clara County agencies.
- At the end of last year's paving programs (2018), Cupertino is estimated to place in the top 12 out of 110 Bay Area agencies.
- *Based on the Pavement Condition of Bay Area Jurisdictions 2018 with other agencies neither rising or falling

Very Good-Excellent (PCI = 80-100)	Newly constructed for resurfaced pavement with few signs of distress.	Percent of 2019 Cupertino Network

Good (PCl = 70-79)	Pavement requiring mostly preventive maintenance and showing only low levels of distress.	15%		
Fair (PCI = 60-69)	Pavement at the low end of this range is significantly distressed and may require a combination of rehabilitation and preventive maintenance.	5%		
At Risk (PCl = 50-59)	Deteriorated pavement requiring immediate attention, including rehabilitative work.	0%		
Poor (PCl = 25-49)	Pavement showing extensive distress and requiring major rehabilitation or reconstruction.	4%		
Failed (PCI = 0-24)	Extremely rough pavement that needs complete reconstruction.	0%		






Street Network Condition 2019 vs Estimated 2024
