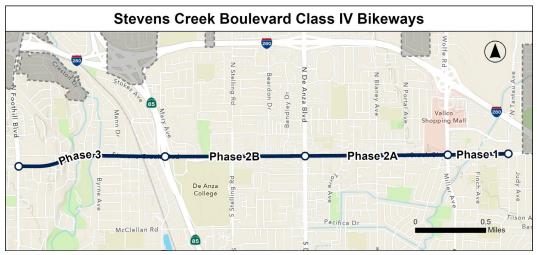

#### **Background Information**

- 2016 Bicycle Transportation Plan determined Stevens Creek Blvd Class IV protected bikeway as the highest priority project
- Project is separated into three phases
- Phase 2 further split into 2A and 2B.



#### **Background Information**

- FY2020-21 CIP Budget approved Phase 2 Design budget of \$350,000
- FY2021-22 CIP Budget approved Phase 2A Construction budget of \$2,000,000 (Phase 2A from Wolfe Rd to De Anza Blvd)
- In 2022, Metropolitan Transportation Commission approved a One Bay Area Grant (OBAG) in the amount of \$807,000
- In 2024, City Council accepted recommendation to partially fund the project with Senate Bill (SB) 1 grant funds in the amount of \$693,000
