This sketch shows the Design Concept in location. The graphic image on the panels will be developed by an artist.





# City Work Program Process

- Commissions submit proposals
- Department Heads and City Manager review proposals
- Proposed City Work Program brought to City Council
  - Items submitted by Commissions will be attached
- City Council adopts City Work Program
- Commissions are notified of any adopted items within their purview

# **Proposal Guidance**

- Within the purview of the Commission
- Timeline of 12 months or less
- Consider staff resources, budget, and routine business of the Commission
- Top 3 proposals, with no more than 5

# **Municipal Code**

2.68.070 Duties-Powers-Responsibilities.

The Library Commission shall have the following duties, powers and responsibilities, and such other as they may be entrusted with by the City Council from time to time:

- A. Consult with the City Council, the City staff and the Santa Clara County Library Joint Powers Authority and staff regarding the functioning of the physical facilities of the Cupertino Library and shall make recommendations from time to time for improvement or modification thereof:
- B. Consult with the City Council, the City staff and the Santa Clara County Library Joint Powers Authority and staff regarding the Cupertino Library programs and services to the community and shall make recommendations from time to time for improvements or modifications thereof;
- C. Consult with and act as liaison with private community groups supportive of the library program;
- D. Consult with the architect and the City Council in the planning of any main or branch library building facilities, including locations, building layout, architecture, landscaping and furnishings;
- E. Hold hearings, formulate policies and make rules and procedures with respect to the foregoing for approval by the City Council;
- F. Perform such other tasks as may be expressly requested of it by the City Council.

### SCCLD Goes Fine Free in 2021

SCCLD is happy to announce the elimination of late fines for all SCCLD materials, including books, magazines, music, and movies. While we haven't charged late fines for children's materials for years, the new change covers materials for all ages. Fine Free goes into effect on January 1, 2021 to kick off the new year.

Existing late fines will also be forgiven, so patrons can start the year with a clean slate. Fees for lost items will remain, and the processing fees have been reduced for most items from \$10 to \$5. Please visit the website for details.



SCCLD also recently launched the new <u>auto-renewal</u> feature. This automatically extends due dates on eligible physical materials from SCCLD. There are a few requirements for eligibility, including more available copies than holds, and not reaching the maximum number of five renewals. Patrons will receive notifications with each successful auto-renewal.

These two changes will greatly benefit all patrons. We know late fines do not affect everyone equally. Especially in tough economic times, public libraries are more critical than ever. These changes help to reduce barriers to our communities and meet one of our core values, providing access to the library and library services.


### Silicon Valley Reads 2021
