# Weston Woods Available Dec 1!

Weston Woods was founded in 1953 by Morton Schindel who became fascinated with picture books while reading to his children.



In 1996, Weston Woods became part of the Scholastic Inc. – the world's largest publisher of children's books.

Enjoy hundreds of children's stories online including classics like *Snowy Day* by Ezra Jack Keats and *Amazing Grace* by Mary Hoffman. There are also modern titles like *We Are Water Protectors* by Carole Lindstrom and illustrated by Michaelea Goade. You can easily find your next great read with filters including grade, age, theme, and lexile level.



Many of these resources have study guides to help educators create lesson plans and curriculum around these books. New readers will be able to utilize the Read Along feature that highlights the words being spoken in the video. Closed captions are also available to help assist in learning and to develop language recognition. Finally, translations are available on some materials in both Spanish and Mandarin. Weston Woods will be found on our website in our Kids Online Library under Learning and Homework Help, eBooks & Audiobooks and Find a Good Book and within the Student Portal.
