# Differences in Concept 1

**Basketball court:** Remains

**Entry/Gathering:** Larger gathering, Entry closer to parking and restroom

**Nest Swings:** Two, near entry and both age groups

**Slide Mtn./Art Elements:** Taller mountain, with an accessible path at 5% slope. Savings in ramps/rails means more budget for unique art elements in this concept.

**Tot Area:** Sand and Water Play, Forest House with slides

**Youth Area:** Globe Spinner for multi-kid, multi-age play





# Differences in Concept 2

**Basketball court:** removed

**Entry/Gathering:** Smaller gathering, Entry further from parking and restroom

**Nest Swing:** 1, near Youth Area/back gate

**Slide Mtn./Art Elements:** Smaller mountain, with an accessible ramp at 8% slope with guardrails. Cost for this is higher and reduces potential art elements.

**Tot Area:** Junior Slide Hill, Log & Boulder Climbing

**Youth Area:** Net Climber for multi-kid/multi-age play, Chalk Art Wall
