
Innovation: Develop measures in short-term and long-term action plans that position Cupertino as a leader in climate innovation and technological development.

Resilience and Adaptation: Establish climate adaptation measures




Greenhouse Gas Reductions by Sector (Annual MT CO2e per person in 2040)
