With the coronavirus scare, I want to hold a health awareness event educating the public on general public disease control practices and handing out respirator masks to everyone in attendance.

### Stolen Possession Avoidance Event

With car thefts and home invasions being unpredictable, I want to hold informational events once a year that would educate residents on best practices to avoid getting caught in these situations.
