David, thank you for the explanation and background information regarding this (now removed) Bike/Ped Commission meeting agenda item, "Civic Center Parking Analysis and Civic Center Parking Deficiencies".

I was surprised to see an item about parking analysis and deficiencies at Civic Center Plaza presented to the Bicycle Pedestrian Commission before it appeared as an agenda item for the Library Commission, which has presented to Council its findings and recommendations related to:

- + suggestions for improving access to the Cupertino city center
- + suggestions to address misuse of time-limited parking stalls in the civic center parking lot
- + results from 4 casual bike lock audits conducted at civic center plaza from November 2019 to January 2020

For Gerhard, Amanda, and Staff: when the City is ready to share its report "Civic Center Parking Analysis and Civic Center Parking Deficiencies," please consider hosting a joint meeting of the Bicycle Pedestrian Commission and the Library Commission as the forum for the first public review of the document. Please also include representatives from the Santa Clara County Library District (SCCLD) in the review meeting because library patrons make up the majority of public visitors to Civic Center Plaza. In 2019, SCCLD conducted its triennial patron survey, which will have gathered rich public comment regarding parking and transportation use affecting and

related to Civic Center Center Plaza. Any analysis of the site, I hope, would include relevant patron survey inputs.
