**Subject: City Council 2-2-21 Item 15
Procedures For Processing General Plan Amendments**

Objections:

- 1) Timing & Processing.** State law allows 4 times per year, the minimum allowed should be twice a year. Once you have decided to move forward on a project, time is money, hearings should not be arbitrarily withheld.
- 2) Project Evaluation.** Your current process includes ample evaluation factors to determine if the Planning Commission and Council desire to support the project. Why add on additional expense for the proponent to have to provide "Traffic Impact Studies and Expected Student Generation" only to have the project denied by the PC or CC. Traffic impacts will have to be addressed if the project is approved and the school districts are capable of assessing and commenting on student generation. Why add additional costs for the proponent before needed.
- 3) Resubmission.** By definition these are projects with minor amendments so why is it necessary to add the time and expense of another Planning Commission hearing for no good reason. Municipalities need to reduce costs as much as possible for project proponents and not arbitrarily add costs.

Dear Mayor Paul, Vice Mayor Chao and Council Members,

Prior to writing this email, I've gone back and listened to both of these meetings regarding this topic and read the materials:

- 2020-07-07 CC Study Session
- 2021-02-12 PC Meeting Agenda Item 3

I strongly request that you do the 4 items in BOLD below.

At the bare minimum, you MUST KEEP the GPA Application Process!

1. **KEEP the GPA Application Process** because
 - a. Before we had this process, projects would be TOTALLY negotiated behind the scenes by the staff and maybe 1 or 2 desirable City Council members.
 - b. No input from the public!
 - c. No input from the City Council majority or the Planning Commission!
 - d. By the time it came to the public's attention at the Planning Commission review, it was a DONE DEAL! Very little could be changed. An enormous amount of staff time and developer money had already gone into this "deal" and nobody felt like they could say "NO"-regardless of the public input.
 - e. It gives future developers a way to see what the Council and public are looking for in acceptable projects.
2. **Postcard to the public needs BOTH the PC and CC exact review dates** (not just 45 days after)
 - a. Text change...In the "Procedure" document (Attachment B Redline) Part 2.e, add text saying the exact dates of both PC and CC meetings will be on the postcard.
 - b. My concern is that the City Council has the ultimate decision regardless of what the PC recommends. The public needs to be informed that the ultimate final decision rests with the City Council so they need to show up for THAT meeting!
3. **Add definitions to add clarity and remove ambiguity**
 - a. Define "**substantial compliance**" with the project authorized...
(reference "Procedure" document, Attachment B Redline Part 2.h)
 - i. Key items like height, setbacks, density, development agreement should be exactly as approved.
 - ii. Any other item that was key to allowing the project to move forward should not be changed.
This should be noted on the approval document if there is an item(s).
 - b. Define "**minor amendments**" regarding the 1-time resubmittal within 6 months
(reference "Procedure" document, Attachment B Redline Part 2.i)

- i. During the PC meeting, they mentioned any changes that reduced the height or setback was considered minor. Also, adding a foot to the height would be considered minor but adding a floor would not. This should be defined exactly. What about setbacks, etc.?

4. KEEP the twice a year review dates BUT

- a. Enforce a hard cut-off date requiring applications to be complete by this cut-off date.
 - i. i.e. ALL necessary documents for a complete application to be submitted by that date
 - ii. have a check list with sign off that can be given to applicants long before the deadline
- b. Twice a year helps everyone, the City Staff, the Council and the public by potentially distributing the amount of material that needs to be reviewed across 2 meetings. If it's a big project, even one packet is a lot to review in detail.
- c. I disagree with the argument that reducing it to once a year discourages applications. What it may do is encourage alternate means to their end by using recently passed state laws.
- d. What discourages applications is to REJECT those that do not benefit the city substantially enough to justify giving the project a general plan amendment!

5. Voluntary Community Amenities

- a. This needs work...maybe as a separate review in the future but keep it in for now.
- b. It's just another word for "community benefits" which I do not believe in.
- c. A project should stand on its own as a community benefit.
- d. It's also not fair across developments. The outcome is based on how skilled or pushy a developer or the City is in negotiating the "amenities".
- e. Sometimes, the amenity offered is not needed or wanted by the majority of residents. So, is it still an amenity if it's of no use or will cost the City enormously to maintain it?
- f. It's not objective.
