


Proclamation

- WHEREAS, The 62nd annual National Public Works Week focuses on sustainable and resilient communities;
- WHEREAS, Public works professionals focus on infrastructure, facilities, and services that are of vital importance to sustainable and resilient communities and to public health, quality of life, and well-being of the people of California and City of Cupertino;
- WHEREAS, These infrastructure, facilities, and services could not be provided without the dedicated efforts of public works professionals, who are responsible for rebuilding, improving, and protecting our nation's transportation systems, parks, public buildings, and other structures and facilities essential for our residents;
- WHEREAS, It is in the public interest for the residents and civic leaders of Cupertino to gain knowledge of and maintain an ongoing interest of the importance of public works programs in their communities;
- WHEREAS, Cupertino 311 is a quick and easy way for residents to submit and follow up on requests and concerns, such as graffiti, potholes, tree requests, street sweeping, and more;
