Background

A Friendship Cities Designation is an established relationship between the City of Cupertino and a partnering international organization that is mutually beneficial. The first step towards establishing a Friendship Cities Designation is to complete this application. This application helps to identify proposed goals of the relationship, the supporting activities expected, and highlights the areas of interest strengths, or needs of each party. The proponents of establishing such a relationship must be a collaboration of a community organization (a Friendship City Committee) and an elected official of the participating international city.

Who May Request a Friendship Cities Designation?

Any established Friendship City Committee of the proponent Friendship City may submit an application. The most successful applications will have more than one sponsor and will represent multiple agencies or organizations.

Processing and Approval of the Application

This application will clearly state the rationale and the goals of the relationship and the mutual benefits in establishing this relationship. Once the designation is in place, all information in the application will be shared with the community and stakeholders upon request.

Complete information for key contacts and authorizing individuals (the signing authorities) must be provided before the relationship can be finalized. In addition, the committee must have a Cupertino Councilmember sponsorship. Incomplete information will delay the process. A Friendship Cities Designation will be authorized for a period of two (2) years as outlined in the City of Cupertino's "Policies and Guidelines on Sister Cities, Friendship Cities, and International Delegations" and will be subject to all guidelines therein.

Section 6 - RATIONALE

The Cupertino-Chengdu Friendship City Association (CCFCA) exists to build goodwill, facilitate cultural exchange, and create mutually beneficial economic ties between the cities of Cupertino, California, USA and Chengdu, Sichuan, PRC. The CCFCA consists of Cupertino citizens, residents of the Bay Area with heritage in Chengdu and Sichuan, and people interested in creating a bridge between these two municipalities.

An immediate goal of the CCFCA is to establish a Friendship City program between Cupertino and Chengdu. This program will benefit the citizens and businesses of Cupertino by providing:

- 1. <u>Connections with thought leaders</u> in Chengdu in the areas of transportation, technology, art, cuisine, and city planning
- 2. <u>Cultural Events</u> that enhance the spice of life
- 3. Educational Opportunities for college students
- 4. <u>Business Opportunities and Networks</u> for established firms and startups

Once established, the first year deliverables of this program that tie to these above goals will be:

- <u>Facilitating 2 to 3 Delegations Per Year</u>: The CCFCA intends for both city leadership, business leaders, and other Cupertino citizens to meet each other in their home cities. This includes annually inviting Cupertino Council members to Chengdu to attending the *Innovation Forum for Mayors of International Sister Cities of Chengdu*. This also includes hosting similar delegations from Chengdu to Cupertino.
- Since spicy cuisine is a hallmark of Chengdu, the CCFCA will host a <u>Sichuan Spicy Food</u> <u>Festival in Cupertino</u>. It will invite relevant local businesses to participate as well as chefs from Chengdu.
- Various festivals and events in Cupertino have representation by various cultural organizations. CCFCA will <u>participate 1 to 2 in cultural festivals</u> in Cupertino.
- <u>Study Abroad for De Anza Community College</u>. The CCFCA will work with De Anza College and interested universities in Chengdu to connect local college students with study abroad opportunities. The members will also act help to facilitate the students who take part with local connections and travel tips.

Two additional areas of interest to the Citizens of Cupertino where there could be opportunities are bicycle/transportation management and technology/entrepreneurship. Bicycling has long been a major mode of transportation for Chengdu, and many of the challenges that face Cupertino in this area may have remedies that Chengdu experts could suggest. For technology, since Chengdu is a major hub of technology development, manufacturing and marketing, it makes sense to explore opportunities for Chengdu businesses that are looking to enter American markets to establish an initial foothold in Cupertino.

Lastly, the CCFCA will apply for non-profit for IRS 501.c.3 status.

7. RESOURCES

The activities outlined above will require no budget from the City of Cupertino. The CCFCA will fund the activities by holding fundraising activities throughout the year, and engaging sponsors. One fundraising activity that the members are practiced in is hosting banquets. For such dinners, the CCFCA will invite following interested associations and hold the events 3-4 times each year.

8. PROFILE

The organization's profile was outlined in section 6. This profile of Chengdu is excerpted from the Wikipedia entry.

Chengdu is the provincial capital of Sichuan province in Southwest China, as well as a major city in Western China. It holds sub-provincial administrative status. As of 2014 the administrative area houses 14,427,500 inhabitants with an urban population of 10,152,632. According to the 2010 census, with 10,484,996 inhabitants in its built-up (or metro) area including Guanghan City in Deyang and Xinjin County, Chengdu is the fifthmost populous agglomeration in China. Chengdu is one of the most important economic, financial, commercial, cultural, transportation, and communication centers in Western China. Chengdu Shuangliu International Airport is one of the 30 busiest airports in the world, and Chengdu Railway Station is one of the six biggest railway stations in China. Chengdu also hosts many international companies and more than 12 consulates. More than 260 Fortune 500 companies have established branches in Chengdu due to huge demand of Western China. In 2006, it was named China's 4th-most liveable city by China Daily.

The fertile Chengdu Plain, on which Chengdu is located, is also known as the "Country of Heaven" (Chinese: 天府之国; pinyin: *Tiānfǔzhiguó*), a phrase also often translated as "The Land of Abundance". The discovery of the Jinsha site suggests the area of Chengdu had become the center of the bronze age Sanxingdui culture around the time of the establishment of the state of Shu, prior to its annexation by Qin in 316 BC.
