RE: Support Senate Bill 23 (Weiner) – Unlawful entry of a vehicle

Dear Senator Weiner:

On behalf of the City of Cupertino, I am writing to express our support for your bill, Senate Bill 13, which clarifies that the definition of auto burglary is entering a vehicle unlawfully with the intent to commit theft.

Under current law, a person arrested for auto burglary can escape a conviction if the prosecutor is unable to prove that the vehicle was locked. The mere fact that a victim's window may have been broken does not, by itself, establish that the vehicle doors were locked. This evidence is especially needed in cases where the victim is unavailable or unknown, which is common amongst tourist victims, since they typically do not return for trials.

Closing this statutory loophole would allow prosecutors to hold auto burglars accountable for their actions, and would help provide peace of mind for both residents and visitors alike throughout the State.

For these reasons, the City of Cupertino is proud to support SB 23.
