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CITY COUNCIL STAFF REPORT

Meeting: May 3, 2022

Subject

Consideration of Municipal Code amendments to the Cupertino Municipal Code, Title 2 to add Chapter 2.96 and codify the Economic Development Committee.

Recommended Action

- 1. Conduct the first reading of Ordinance No. ____ "An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Cupertino Adding Chapter 2.96 of Title 2 (Administration and Personnel) to Codify the Economic Development Committee".
- 2. Find that the proposed actions are exempt from CEQA.

Discussion

The Economic Development Committee (EDC) has met informally for well over two decades to discuss items of importance pertinent to local businesses and to provide feedback to staff on business-related City initiatives or projects.

As part of the FY 2021-2022 City Work Program discussion, the City Council requested that the EDC be codified in the Municipal Code through an ordinance.

The proposed ordinance for the EDC has been drafted based on input from Council and staff research on economic development committees in other local cities.

Powers and Functions:

The powers and functions of the Committee shall be to serve in an advisory capacity to the City Council and to provide expertise and guidance on policy related to economic development. The Committee shall also actively promote Cupertino as a location of choice for current and prospective businesses.

To fulfill their mission, the Committee may involve itself in the following activities:

 Make recommendations to City Council on a broad range of strategic matters broadly applicable to the City's economic development goals;

- 2. Serve as an ambassador to shed a positive light on the City by sharing economic development resources and information to prospective businesses and stakeholders, thus positioning the City as a location of choice; and
- 3. Encourage public/private partnerships to further the City's economic development goals by identifying potential resources.

Membership:

As proposed, the membership of this new Committee would consist of five members, including elected officials, industry sector representatives, and key partners:

- 1. City Councilmember
- 2. City Councilmember
- 3. Technology Sector Representative
- 4. Retail/Small Business Representative
- 5. Hospitality/Tourism Sector Representative

Term:

Committee members would serve an initial term of four years, with a possibility to serve for an additional four years. Committee members would not serve for more than two consecutive terms.

Economic Development Committees/Commissions in Other Cities

Staff conducted research on economic development committees in other cities in Santa Clara County and the local area. Out of the 18 other cities surveyed, five have active economic development commissions or committees that are subcommittees of Council. Palo Alto is currently in the process of forming one. Details on the composition and purpose of the commissions or committees in these cities are below:
