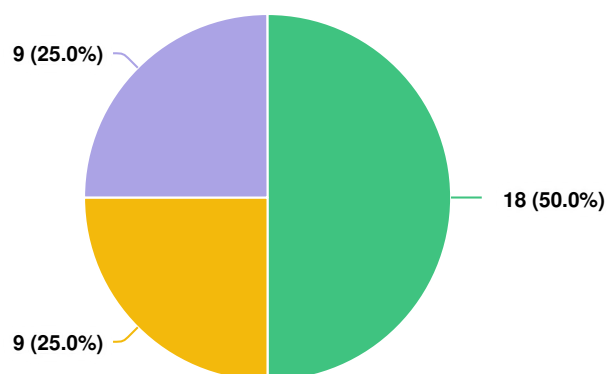

Q2 Which name do you believe best depicts a broadened reach for the Fine Arts Commission Name Change?



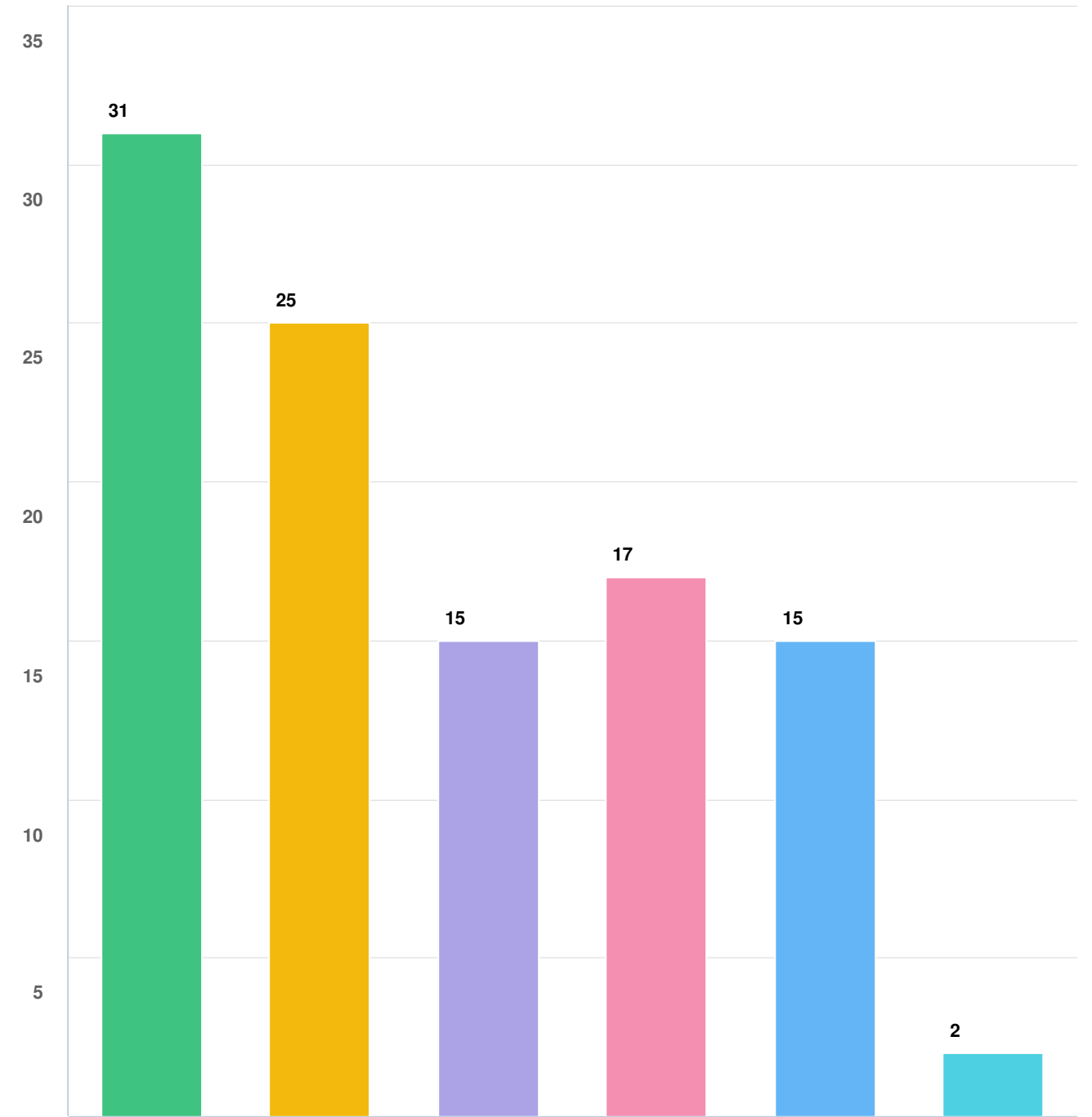
