SPECIAL NOTICE OF VACANCY

Notice is hereby given that the City of Cupertino is accepting applications for one unscheduled vacancy on the Housing Commission (as the Financial Representative). The vacancy occurred when Commissioner Poonam Goyal resigned. The (partial) term of this vacancy expires on 1/30/22 and will count as a full term. The Financial Representative must represent a financial institution that is located in Cupertino to be eligible. This position is open until filled.

The Cupertino Housing Commission consists of five members appointed by the council to four-year terms. One must be a representative from a Cupertino financial institution and another from a Cupertino business. Housing Commission members who are representatives of a financial institution or a business are not required to be Cupertino residents, but the financial institution and the business represented must be located in Cupertino. The three remaining community members must be residents of Cupertino. The commission assists in developing housing policies and strategies, recommends policies for implementation and monitoring of affordable housing projects, helps identify sources of funding for affordable housing and performs other advisory functions authorized by the City Council (also see Municipal Code Chapter [2.86.100](#) Duties–Powers–Responsibilities). The Cupertino Housing Commission falls under the Political Reform Act of 1974 and financial disclosure is required.
