U-verse Programming Changes

AT&T contracts with programmers for the content displayed on U-verse TV® service periodically expire, or may be terminated, but are usually re-negotiated or extended with no interruption or change for our U-verse members. Additionally, from time to time it is necessary to change channel line-ups as well as television package contents. The programming changes set forth below may occur as follows:

April 2019

As previously noticed, AT&T contracts with the programmers for the following channels are set to expire. While these channels will continue to be available to U-verse members so long as AT&T has the rights to carry them, if reasonable agreements cannot be reached with the programmers the programming will no longer be available. AT&T may modify the channel locations for the programming by moving them from their current channel locations to channels between 9501 – 9599, and if reasonable longer-term agreements cannot be reached with the programmers, we may lose the rights to carry them (listed in alphabetical order) in or after April 2019: A&E (channel 132 and 1132 in HD); A&E – West (channel 132 and 1132 in HD); Crime & Investigation Network (channel 163 and 1163 in HD); FYI (channel 272 and 1272 in HD); FYI - West (channel 272 and 1272 in HD); EVINE Live and EVINE Live in HD; GMA Pinoy (channel 3683); Heroes & Icons (channel 137 and 1137 in HD); History (channel 256 and 1256 in HD); History – West (channel 256 and 1256 in HD); History en Espanol (channel 3104 in HD); Lifetime Real Women (channel 364); Lifetime Television (channel 360 and 1360 in HD); Lifetime Television - West (channel 361 and 1361 in HD); LMN (channel 362 and 1362 in HD); LMN – West (channel 362 and 1362 in HD); MBC America (channel 3643); MeTV (channel 23, 136 and 1023 and 1136 in HD); Military History Channel (channel 276); NFL Network (channel 630 and 1630 in HD); NFL RedZone (channel 1629 in HD); Sportsman Channel (channel 642 and 1642 in HD); Viceland (channel 257 and 1257 in HD); Viceland - West (channel 257 and 1257 in HD); and World Fishing Network (channel 1679 in HD);

As well as the following:

- 1) Los Angeles, CA area, KAZA (channel 54 and 1054 in HD).

Effective April 30, 2019, the following U-verse applications will no longer be available to U-verse customers:

- 1) FITFUSION TV Featuring Jillian Michaels STB application (Ch. 440/633 and 1440/1633) and Interactive Menu,
- 2) Tumblebooks STB TV application (Ch. 345/1345) and Interactive Menu, and
- 3) U-verse Games STB TV application (Ch. 93/1093 and 321/1321) and Interactive Menu.

May 2019

As previously noticed, AT&T contracts with the programmers for the following channels are set to expire. While these channels will continue to be available to U-verse members so long as AT&T has the rights to carry them, if reasonable agreements cannot be reached with the programmers the programming will no longer be available. AT&T may modify the channel locations for the programming by moving them from their current channel locations to channels between 9501 – 9599, and if reasonable longer-term agreements cannot be reached with the programmers, we may lose the rights to carry them (listed in alphabetical order) in or after May 2019: Canal 22 (channel 3022 in HD); Canal Once (channel 3011 in HD); HITN (channel 3055 in HD); and PX Sports (channel 3122 in HD).

In addition:

- 1) Effective 5/14/19, the following U-verse TV packages will not include Nick Jr. (channel 320 and 1320 in HD) and Nick Jr. - West (channel 320): U-Family, U100, U200, U200 Latino and U400. Current customers may visit tvpromise.com to obtain more information about how this change may apply to them and available options;
- 2) The Time Life Channel (channel 229, 359 and 1229, 1359 in HD) will expire on or after May 31, 2019.

June 2019

AT&T contracts with the programmers for the following channels are set to expire. While these channels will continue to be available to U-verse members so long as AT&T has the rights to carry them, if reasonable agreements cannot be reached with the programmers the programming will no longer be available. AT&T may modify the channel locations for the programming by moving them from their current channel locations to channels between 9501 – 9599, and if reasonable longer-term agreements cannot be reached with the programmers, we may lose the rights to carry them (listed in alphabetical order) in or after June 2019: aapka (channel 3712); Baby First TV (channel 310); Baby First TV en Espanol (channel 3063); CBS Sports Network (channel 643 and 1643 in HD) ET-Global (channel 3632); ET-News (channel 3631); MTV India (channel 3709); Outdoor Channel (channel 680 and 1680 in HD);

As well as the following:

- 1) Los Angeles, CA area, KCBS (channel 2 and 1002 in HD), KCAL (channel 9 and 1009 in HD);
- 2) Sacramento, CA area KOVR (channel 13 and 1013 in HD), KMAX (channel 31 and 1031 in HD);
- 3) San Francisco, CA area, KPIX (channel 5 and 1005 in HD), KBCW (channel 44 and 1044 in HD).

Customers will be provided with written notification of the above: customer bills include a message referring them to the Legal Notices in USA Today on the first and third Tuesday of each month, and to the AT&T website <https://www.att.com/esupport/article.html#!/u-verse-tv/KM1333754> for information on programming changes.
