U-verse Programming Changes

AT&T contracts with programmers for the content displayed on U-verse TV° service periodically expire, or may be terminated, but are usually re-negotiated or extended with no interruption or change for our U-verse members. Additionally, from time to time it is necessary to change channel line-ups as well as television package contents. The programming changes set forth below may occur as follows:

May 2019

As previously noticed, AT&T contracts with the programmers for the following channels are set to expire. While these channels will continue to be available to U-verse members so long as AT&T has the rights to carry them, if reasonable agreements cannot be reached with the programmers the programming will no longer be available. AT&T may modify the channel locations for the programming by moving them from their current channel locations to channels between 9501 – 9599, and if reasonable longer-term agreements cannot be reached with the programmers, we may lose the rights to carry them (listed in alphabetical order) in or after May 2019: EVINE Live and EVINE Live in HD; GMA Pinoy (channel 3683); Heroes & Icons (channel 137 and 1137 in HD); HITN (channel 3055 in HD); MBC America (channel 3643); MeTV (channel 23, 136 and 1023 and 1136 in HD); NFL Network (channel 630 and 1630 in HD); NFL RedZone (channel 1629 in HD); Pursuit HD (channel 1644 in HD); The Time Life Channel (channel 229, 359 and 1229, 1359 in HD);

As well as the following:

1) Los Angeles, CA area, KAZA (channel 54 and 1054 in HD).

In addition: Effective 5/14/19, the following U-verse TV packages will not include Nick Jr. (channel 320 and 1320 in HD) and Nick Jr. - West (channel 320): U-Family, U100, U200, U200 Latino and U400. Current customers may visit tvpromise.com to obtain more information about how this change may apply to them and available options.

<u>June 2019</u>

As previously noticed, AT&T contracts with the programmers for the following channels are set to expire. While these channels will continue to be available to U-verse members so long as AT&T has the rights to carry them, if reasonable agreements cannot be reached with the programmers the programming will no longer be available. - 2) Sacramento, CA area KOVR (channel 13 and 1013 in HD), KMAX (channel 31 and 1031 in HD);
- 3) San Francisco, CA area, KPIX (channel 5 and 1005 in HD), KBCW (channel 44 and 1044 in HD).

July 2019

AT&T contracts with the programmers for the following channels are set to expire. While these channels will continue to be available to U-verse members so long as AT&T has the rights to carry them, if reasonable agreements cannot be reached with the programmers the programming will no longer be available. AT&T may modify the channel locations for the programming by moving them from their current channel locations to channels between 9501 – 9599, and if reasonable longer-term agreements cannot be reached with the programmers, we may lose the rights to carry them (listed in alphabetical order) in or after July 2019: EPIX (channel 891 and channel 1891 in HD); EPIX West (channel 892 and channel 1892 in HD); EPIX 2 (channel 893 and channel 1893 in HD); EPIX Drive-In (channel 896); EPIX HITS (channel 1894); Family Entertainment TV (channel 578);

As well as the following:

- 1) Bakersfield, CA area, KKEY (channel 11 and 3007 in HD), KGETD2 (channel 16 and channel 1016 in HD), KGET (channel 17 and channel 1017 in HD);
- 2) Fresno, CA area, KSEE (channel 24 and channel 1024 in HD), KGPE (channel 47 and channel 1047 in HD);
- 3) San Francisco, CA area, KRON (channel 4 and 1004 in HD).
