This is Krithika V, reaching out to you on behalf of the Cupertino Teen Commission. The Commission consists of nine teens from middle and high schools in our area, who advise the City Council and staff on issues and projects important to youth.

One project that we have been coordinating with the Parks and Recreation Department over the last three years is <hack> Cupertino. <hack> Cupertino, which will take place next year from Friday, March 20th, 2020 to Saturday, March 21st 2020, is a 13-hour overnight hackathon organized by Cupertino's Teen Commission and Cupertino's Recreation Department, and is geared towards middle and high school students. During our opening ceremony, we will present a problem relevant to the City of Cupertino which teens and their teams will work together to address.
