<hack> Cupertino 2021	Continue collaboration with Cupertino's Parks and Recreation Department to organize the 5th annual <hack> Cupertino, a 13-hour overnight hackathon for teens ages 13-18. The goal is to give youth a simultaneous enriching and recreational opportunity.
Bobateeno	Continue collaboration with the Mayor's Office to host an event for students ages 12-18 and provide them with a platform to socialize and enjoy a day outside with various activities while drinking free milk tea. The event is designed to give teens a respite from daily stressors and for them to discover valuable resources while enjoying mobile recreation activities.
Addressing traffic safety at schools	Through collaborations with the Bike-Ped Commission and Safe Routes 2 School program, the Teen Commission would like to find ways to improve traffic around schools.
