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# Why?

- Schools will need to reopen for the 2020-2021 School Year
- It is predicted that Social Distancing Rules might relax by the beginning of the School Year
- Threat of COVID-19 is still real
- Schools Must open, but still enforce some sort of social distancing

## My Proposal - All Schools

- Enforce Social Distancing by cutting capacity to indoor spaces
  - Cafetaria
  - Gyms
  - Auditoriums
- Have the Necessary Precautions for reducing infections
  - Hand Sanitizers
  - Temperature Checks
- Prepare Supplementary Online Curriculum for Learning
- Plans in Place for Students/Teachers/Administrators with Pre-existing conditions or Parents who are not Willing
- Events and Non-academic items will be done online

### My Proposal - All Schools

- Students will go to School for one day in the week
  - All classes will be 45 minutes long (Middle and High Schools)
  - Each class will have a maximum of 12 students
  - Time can be spent for labs, tests, or anything the teacher feels necessary
  - Rest of the days of the week will be spent through online learning
- Teachers will go to School for 2-3 days a week
  - They will be teaching 12 students in person at a time
  - In Classroom Social Distancing should be enforced
- School Administration will be Present on all weekdays
