## FUHSD-COVID TASK FORCE SUGGESTIONS AND CONCERNS (Cupertino Teen Commission)

## Suggestions:

- There was a concern that Choir is unable to hold classes virtually.
  - Fremont High choir teacher has been hosting Zoom calls once a week. Plays instructional videos, and pauses the videos to give more commentary. Students are then required to send a personal recording which the teacher critiques
- Concern that PE courses cannot be held virtually.
  - Lawson Middle School PE teachers have been asking students to record themselves doing a predetermined set of exercises. If students feel uncomfortable students can submit a parent signature instead
- Concern about sports teams being unable to hold practices
  - \*\*\*Rumored that Cupertino High football team is beginning to hold conditioning sessions where athletes can still stay in shape while social-distancing (If true, other schools and sports can follow suit.)
- Cupertino Teen Commission believes that the public should be and would like to be more informed about topics that the FUHSD COVID-19 committee is talking about.
  - The Commission suggests that a form be sent out to all FUHSD students and parents with all issues currently being discussed. A space should be provided under each of these issues for comment and suggestion.
    - Benefits:
    - Allows the public to feel more at ease knowing that the district is working hard to address concerns.
    - Keeps public informed
    - Allows for more suggestions
  - A section of the FUHSD website can be made to address community concerns
  - Meeting minutes/notes of the committee should be made available to the general public

## **Concerns:**

- Sports scholarships
  - A Commissioner explained that some of her friends are reliant on these scholarships in paying for college, how would it work in COVID-19 times as students are not able to play sports?
- How would testing and AP Classes work
  - How should we amend virtual curriculum so that they will be sufficient in preparing students for AP and related exams?
- How would school work if not all students can attend in-person classes
  - When some students cannot come to school because of pre-existing conditions, what should they do to maintain their academic standing
- Student Transportation
  - VTA Buses might be crowded
  - General Traffic Problems
  - How would drop off and pick-up be coordinated by parents?
- Ceramics and 3-D design, orchestra not possible virtually
  - How would art classes specifically the ones above work in a partial distance learning environment?
