 - Standard mitigating measures will be in place during construction to reduce dust and exhaust
- Hazardous Materials
 - The removed soil will be disposed in of in accordance with all local, State and Federal requirements.
- □ Utilities and Service Systems
 - The lots are subject to the State's C3 stormwater requirements, as such the lots will need to retain bioretention basins in a Public Works easement
- □ Traffic
 - The traffic study indicates that the traffic increase in the area will not have a significant impact
- □ Archeological/Cultural
 - There will be a Stop Work Order in the construction documents should any remains or artifacts be discovered on site
- Noise
 - o Standard mitigating measures will be in place during construction to reduce noise
 - The noise study indicates that the overall noise generated from the project is less than significant
