Greg Bracci, Vice President of Envirosuite, Ltd., presented the PowerPoint on file in the Commission records.

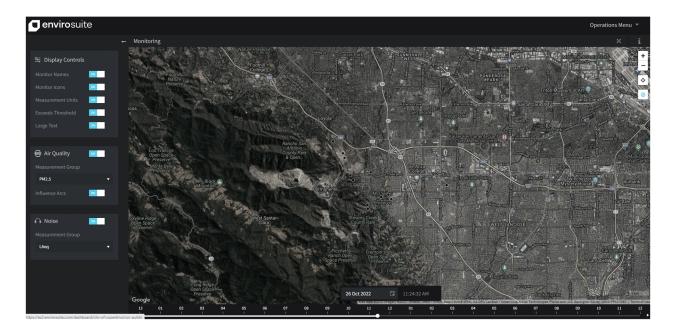
The presentation started with an overview of Dust and Air, and Noise Quality monitors capabilities like real time alerting and reporting.

With the station monitors, staff can obtain real-time data, receive alerts triggered based on predefined thresholds, and can therefore analyze the data and current events.

The web portal allows an enhanced knowledge of possible air quality and noise level impacts. Station monitors are alike those on the airports and are calibrated routinely.

Mr. Bracci proceeded with demonstrating the public portal available to all in the City's webpage:

Mr. Bracci reviewed the Display controls used for filtering Monitor names, air and noise monitor icons, measurement units such as decibels for noise and particulate matter for air.

Background:

License Plate Recognition: In partnership with the County Sheriff, install LPR devices for the automated detection of license plates. This data will only be for official law enforcement purposes, including identifying stolen or wanted vehicles, stolen license plates and missing persons. It may also be used to gather information related to active warrants, homeland security, electronic surveillance, suspect interdiction, and stolen property recovery.

Cybersecurity: Provide education on cybersecurity to City residents, guests, and businesses. A subcommittee was formed consisting of Commissioners Soundararajan ad Du.

Climate Monitoring and Noise Measurement: Pilot project extended another year. The project consists of installing sensors to monitor Pollution and Noise Environments in the area adjacent to Lehigh and Stevens Creek Quarry. Each location has two sensors, to monitor noise and air quality levels.

The Commission thanked CTO Mitchell for the informative update.

CITY OF CUPERTINO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE SPECIAL NOTICE OF VACANCIES

Notice is hereby given that the City of Cupertino has seven vacancies on the Economic Development Committee. The City Council voted to codify the Committee on July 19, 2022. The application deadline is 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, November 10, 2022. Council will conduct interviews and make appointments late November. Council may also appoint alternates to fill any unscheduled vacancies that may occur during the year. The vacancies are open until filled.

Eligibility Requirements:

The Committee consists of nine (9) members appointed by the Council to overlapping four-year terms, comprised of: (1) two Councilmembers; (2) one representative from each of the following industry sectors - Technology, Retail, Hospitality, Education, and Commercial Real Estate; (3) one member who is currently serving on the Sustainability Commission; and (4) one member who is currently serving on the Technology, Information, and Communications Commission. At least two industry sector representative Committee Members shall be Cupertino residents. The term of office for Committee Members shall be staggered with the initial appointment of five members to two-year terms and four members to four-year terms. Following the initial appointment, all members shall be appointed to four-year terms. None of the industry sector representative Committee Members shall be officials or employees of the City. No member of the Committee shall cohabit with, as defined by law, nor be related by blood or marriage, to any other member of the Committee, to the City Manager, or to any staff person(s) who may be assigned to assist this Committee. The Economic Development Committee falls under the Political Reform Act of 1974 and financial disclosure is required.

Powers and Functions

Advises the City Council to provide expertise and guidance on policy related to economic development including promoting Cupertino as a location of choice for current and

prospective businesses. The Committee makes recommendations on a broad range of strategic matters broadly applicable to the City's economic development goals; serves as an ambassador to shed a positive light on the City by sharing economic development resources and information to prospective businesses and stakeholders; and encouraging public/private partnerships to further the City's economic development goals by identifying potential resources. 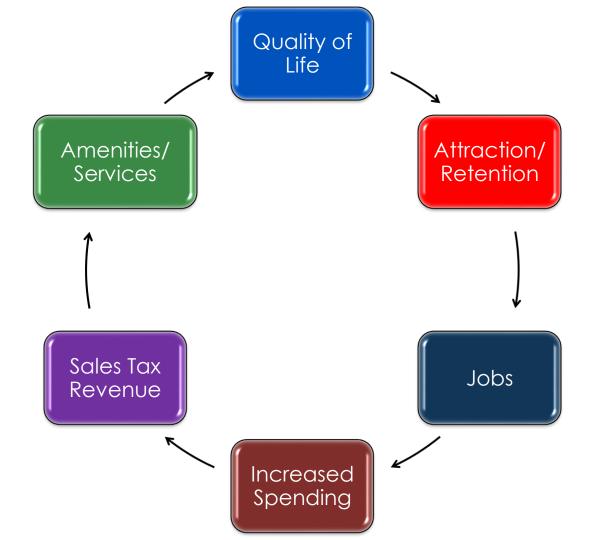
